

# More firms announce new partners

**Firms in Mexico, El Salvador and Honduras have announced further additions to their partnerships in January.**

In Mexico, Von Wobeser y Sierra SC, Cervantes Sainz Abogados and Solórzano, Carvajal, González y Pérez-Correa SC boosted their partnerships, while García & Bodán added new partners in Honduras and El Salvador.

Von Wobeser y Sierra has promoted two associates to partner: Adrián Magallanes and Edmond Grieger.

The promotions came into effect on 1 January.

New York University-educated Magallanes, 31, who has been with the firm since 2002, will continue to develop his practice in arbitration, litigation, government procurement, constitutional and administrative law. Grieger, 34, who has studied at Germany's Johannes Gutenberg Universität in Mainz, will continue to focus on energy and natural resources, environment, constitutional and administrative proceedings, government procurement, real estate, tourism and hospitality.

As of 1 January Alejandro Campillo and Juan Carlos Cajigas were appointed as partners at Cervantes Sainz.

Cajigas, who has been at the firm since 2002, and Campillo, who joined in 2005, both specialise in civil and commercial litigation.

At Solórzano Carvajal, José Covarrubias was promoted to partner.

Covarrubias focuses his practice on civil and commercial litigation before national courts, and local and international arbitrations before the International Chamber of Commerce. He has been with the firm since 2003, having previously worked in the San Francisco offices of US firm Shiff Hardin, LLP. Solórzano Carvajal's partnership now numbers six lawyers.

Meanwhile in Central America, García & Bodán has boosted its corporate practice with the promotion of two associates to partner in its El Salvador and Honduras offices.

In the El Salvador office, newly promoted Julio Vargas, 30, will also become managing partner. He has been with the firm for four years and served as office coordinator since 2010.

In Honduras, Ricardo Duarte, 37, was promoted, after joining as an associate in 2006. He has experience in corporate, civil, labour and administrative law matters.

The promotions at García & Bodán came into effect on 14 January.
